Frequently Asked Questions and Sample Schedule - Adult Inpatient Services -

Will I be included in the development of my treatment plan?

Yes. You will meet with a coordinator who is a member of your multiple-disciplinary team in order to develop an individualized plan to specifically address your acute inpatient goals.

How often will I meet with someone about my medications?

You will meet with a psychiatrist/NPP three times per week to adjust and evaluate the effectiveness of your medications.

How often will I meet with a therapist?

You will meet with your individual therapist three times per week. You will also be meeting with a treatment coordinator for a social assessment as well as treatment planning which will occur throughout your stay.

Will my family participate in treatment?

We highly value family participation in treatment. It is recommended that we include a member of your family or support group in your treatment to educate them on your diagnosis and treatment recommendations. Family sessions are also a great time to educate your loved one on your support plan so that they can assist you with using this plan when outside the hospital.

Will I be able to have visitors?

Visitors are permitted during the unit's scheduled visiting hours. In order to ensure patient safety and confidentiality all visitors must follow the hospital's "visitor guidelines" and must first check in at the Woodlawn Administration Building to obtain a visitor's pass.

What does an average day look like?

Adult Service accentuates the importance of our therapeutic community and therefore promotes many community activities. Our group therapy program is extensive and clinically rich. Therapy and skills training groups are throughout the day 7 days a week. Please see the example of a group schedule below.

Will my outpatient providers be informed about my treatment?

Upon admission you will be asked to sign a release of information for your outpatient treatment providers. Your therapist and medication prescriber will reach out to your team to exchange information. They will be included in discharge plan and will be provided with a clinical summary outlining your treatment and recommendations.

Will I be involved in the development of my discharge plan?

Developing a discharge plan is highly individualized and collaborative between the treatment team and patient. Discussing a longer range plan to continue to address your clinical issues will begin early in your treatment.
